National League of POW/MIA Families

The National League of POW/MIA Families in Southeast Asia's sole purpose is to obtain the release of all prisoners, the fullest possible accounting for the missing and repatriation of all recoverable remains of those who died serving our nation during the Vietnam War. The Chapter

takes out an annual membership in the National League of POW/MIA Families. They have a convention in June and the Chapter has an ad space where the Chapter honors four men from this area that are POW or MIA from the Vietnam War:

Robert W. Brownlee Jr. – he was a military advisor to the South Vietnamese Army. He was listed as MIA on April 24, 1972 in Kontum Province, South Vietnam when his group was over ran. Robert's home was listed as Chicago, IL. Robert's wife, Audrey, lives in Appleton.

James K. Brueggemann – he was on the submarine, USS Scorpion, that was declared missing in the Atlantic Ocean on May 22, 1968. James was from Appleton. He did not die in the Vietnam War but during that time period.

Eugene DeBruin – he had served in the U.S. Air Force. After serving in the U.S. Air Force he worked for Air America. It was a CIA type of operation. On September 5, 1963, Eugene's plane was shot down in Laos where he was captured and held prisoner. Eugene was from Kaukauna.

Richard J. Hentz – he was in the U.S. Army. The surveillance plane he was on was shot down and he was listed as MIA on March 4, 1971. Richard was from Oshkosh.

(Hopefully one day the guys will come HOME.)

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS – NAVY



The **Navy Cross** is the second highest military decoration for valor that may be awarded to a member of the United States Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard for extraordinary heroism in combat. The Navy Cross is bestowed by the Secretary of the Navy and may also be awarded to members of the other armed services, and to foreign military personnel while serving with the U.S. naval services. The Navy Cross was instituted in part due to the entrance of the United States into World War I. The Navy Cross was established by Act of Congress (Public Law 65-253) and approved on February 4, 1919 but retroactive to 6 April 1917. Since its creation, it has been awarded more than 6,300 times. It was designed by James Earle Fraser.




