Vietnam History

Vietnam's recorded history stretches back to 2879 BCE. The Red River Valley, bounded by mountains on one side, the sea on the other, were natural barriers; this coupled with its difficult terrain made Vietnam difficult to attack. It remained independent until the Chinese Millennium began in 111 BCE. Once conquered, Vietnam was unable to escape Chinese ruled for the next 1000 years.

In 939 CE, Vietnam's sovereign power was restored, and a series of dynasties ruled for nearly 1000 years. During this time there were many civil wars which divided the country and invited intervention from the Chinese, Mongols, Dutch, Manchurians, and French. The French gained control in the 19th Century and formed a protectorate with colony status called Cochinchina.

In the 1930s, Marxism was introduced to the area. Japan invaded what was then known as Indochina in 1940. Japan allowed the French Vichy government to remain as a "puppet". Japan was defeated in 1945. Then, Ho Chi Minh proclaimed the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV), naming himself as chairman. His rule was short-lived; the French tried to regain power and were eventually defeated at Dien Bien Phu.

The 1954 Geneva Conference left Vietnam divided with Ho Chi Minh ruling the North and Ngo Dinh Diem ruling the South. The US/ Vietnam War ensued. Since 1976, Vietnam has been a unified country in the form of a Socialist Republic.

One of Chapter 351's members, Merle Sanderfoot, was recently recognized as Kaukauna Volunteer of the Year. Merle volunteers for the 1000 Islands Environmental Center, the food pantry, and the Vietnam Veterans Chapter 351 Highway Cleanup Crew.
