Wisconsin Vietnam War Casualties

According to the Defense Casualty Analysis System, the total record count of deaths for Wisconsin is 1,161 as of April 29, 2008. (www.archives.gov/aad)

The month of January is 5th and Febuary is 3rd in the number of casualties for the State of Wisconsin. Wisconsin had 210 casualties overall for January and February during the duration of the war. Out of the group of 20 soldiers below, 0% Air Force, 25% Marines, 60% Army and 15% Navy paid the ultimate sacrifice.
