Wisconsin Vietnam War Casualties

According to the Defense Casualty Analysis System, the total record count of deaths for Wisconsin is 1,161 as of April 29, 2008. (www.archives.gov/aad)

The casualties for January was 95 which places it in third out for 10 and February had 115 casualties which is third in the in the number of casualties for the State of Wisconsin. Wisconsin had 210 casualties overall for January and February during the duration of the war. Out of the group of 20 soldiers below, 35% Marines, 50% Army, 10% Navy and 5% for the Air Force paid the ultimate sacrifice. (Notice first three entries from each month from five County area.)


